What is Day Treatment?

 Our day Treatment staff provides intensive group counseling and case management services to children and adolescents beginning at age 8 and in third grade through age 18 or until graduation, who are on an IEP and identified with a severe behavioral and emotional problem (SED) and cannot function effectively in regular school settings.

Our team includes:

- Case managers who work directly with the clients to develop individual treatment plans
- Certified Special Education Teachers
- Consulting Child Psychiatric Services are available to diagnose and identify treatment needs at the request of the parent or guardian.

Goals of the Treatment Program

- Offer education on issues such as family problems, anger management, conflict resolution, social skills, self regulation of behavior, and accepting responsibility for own behavior.
- Encourage youth to manage feelings such as anger and sadness
- Increase youth's self-esteem
- Foster the development of skills to improve academic success
- Improve communication skills between peers and adults
- Present alternatives to delinquent behavior patterns
- Support parents and assist them to become confident with their parenting

Clients are referred to FRS Connections by their local school district Special Education Supervisor or Director.

Who would benefit from Day Treatment?

- Children and adolescents who have difficulty relating to others, problems at school, severe acting out behaviors, or difficulties with emotional problems such as depression.
- Youth who require a more intensive and structured therapeutic environment than can be provided by weekly outpatient visits.

How Day Treatment Works

- Day Treatment bases goals on individual needs and consultations with the parents, school professionals, and other treatment providers.
- Day Treatment staff work closely with school professionals to improve the chances for a successful transition back to school.
- Parental/Guardian involvement increases the chance for each individual's therapeutic success and is a required component of the program.



Hours of operation

We have programs available in both Hillsboro and West Union.

- Our program operates on a traditional school schedule. Counseling services are embedded into the program with educational services provided for three hours per day by a certified teacher from either Hillsboro City Schools or Adams County Ohio Valley Local Schools.
- A Summer Day Treatment Program is available to provide an opportunity for your child to actively engage in supervised and structured small group counseling and social experiential outings. These groups will include, but not be limited to Anger Management, Conflict Resolution, Community Social Skills, Selfawareness and Behavior Responsibility, and Making Healthy Choices/Accepting Consequences.
